Phyllis Mwangi is founder and CEO of Edge Consult Ltd., an HR training and consulting firm, and runs a girls' mentorship program and leadership camp. She is also founder of Zahiria, a nonprofit craft business that employs poor Kenyan women and markets their products in the U.S.
